Course Objectives

Cost accounting provides valuable information for management planning and control. Organizations rely on accurate cost information to decide on which products to keep and which products to discontinue, for assessing productivity improvements and for performance evaluation and control. An improperly designed cost accounting system can lead to costly errors in decision-making. Intense competition in product markets has forced firms to look inward to become more cost-efficient. Tracing various resource costs accurately to products has become increasingly important as product margins are squeezed. Manufacturing environments has also undergone significant changes. To support decision-making in these environments, cost accounting systems also need to be redesigned. Through a number of studies, this course exposes students to recent advances in cost accounting, and highlights important inputs into the design of cost systems.

Our course will focus on (1) an understanding for the important characteristics of good cost systems and (2) analyzing the role of cost information in a variety of management decision such as pricing, product mix, and performance measurement.
